**Report on Jyotirao Govindrao Phule Jayanti**

Jyotirao Govindrao Phule (11 April 1827 – 28 November 1890) was an Indian activist, thinker, social reformer and writer from Maharashtra. His work extended to many fields including eradication of untouchability and the caste system, women's emancipation and the reform of Hindu family life. In September 1873, Phule, along with his followers, formed the Satyashodhak Samaj (Society of Seekers of Truth) to attain equal rights for peasants and people from lower castes.

Phule is regarded as an important figure of the Social Reform Movement in Maharashtra. He and his wife, Savitribai Phule, were pioneers of women's education in India. He is most known for his efforts to educate women and the lower castes. He opened the first school for girls in India in August 1848. Due to his efforts and contribution to the society, society awarded him degree of “Mahatma” and thus is famously known as Mahatma Phule. We celebrated Mahatma Phule Jayanti in our college on 11th April. On this occasion Day college Vice Principal Dr. Mhetre Rani and All teaching and non-teaching staff along with students paid homage to Mahatma Jyotiba Phule on his birth anniversary.
